For a different Seville experience, stay in the small but stylish Triana House in an 18th-century building close to the Guadalquivir river in the cool and characterful Triana neighbourhood. Design here is bold with zig-zag patterns on the walls and floors in black, white and pale teal, with art deco features. You feel as if you are staying in a private club or the house of a friend with particularly good taste. The suite on the top floor has its own terrace. While there is no restaurant — or any facilities really — breakfast is brought to your room and some of the city's best tapas bars, of both the traditional and gastrobar varieties, are in this atmospheric area.
